THE NEGROES

Equality Asked for Colored Schools.

PETITION TO COUNCIL.

Postell's Nomination Rejected by the Senate.

A big crowd of negroes met

cently in the Colored Methodist

Church. Speeches were made and

resolutions offered regarding the

public schools.

The result of the meeting is apt

to produce a mild sensation.

Peter Morgan was elected chairman

of the meeting and E. W. Glass

secretary.

A. C. Brent made a statement

regarding the condition of the schools

and Prof. Maxwell exhibited a draft

of a proposed new building and told its

probable cost.

Then Ed Glass took the floor and

made a flaming speech. He opposed the

idea of building "a county school

house," and asked that a committee be

appointed to wait on the City Council

with a request that an ordinance be

passed putting the colored school on an

equality with the white schools.

A number of others spoke in favor

of Glass's suggestion.

Robt. Lander offered the following

resolution, which was unanimously

adopted:

Resolved—That it is the sense of

the meeting that a committee be

appointed to petition the Council to

pass an ordinance putting the colored

school on the same basis as that of

the white school, and that a tax be

levied on all persons and property of the

city for the purpose of making such

additions and buildings as are

needed for the purpose of placing the

colored school on an equality with the

white school, and that the committee

be authorized to do all things necessary

to carry out the foregoing resolution.

A. C. Banks had the following

resolution adopted:

Resolved—That the Board of Council

be petitioned to convene in special

session as early as possible to

consider the petition of the committee

representing the colored school.

The petition has not yet been

prepared. Its first points will be:

First—That the council accept for

Hopkinsville a charter of a city of the

fourth class.

Second—That the city erect a brick

building to be used by the colored people

as a public school.

Third—That the colored schools be

put on the same footing, both as to

privileges and facilities, with the

white schools.

Fourth—That both the colored and

white schools be placed under the

management and conducted by the

same superintendent.

Fifth—That the one board of trustees

be elected for both white and colored

schools.
