

Articles in the *Filson Club Historical Quarterly* and the *Register of the Kentucky Historical Society* Related to the Jackson Purchase

The Filson Club is a private historical organization founded in 1884 in Louisville, Kentucky. Membership is open to all. It is named after John Filson, an early explorer of the Commonwealth, who wrote *The Discovery, Settlement, and Present State of Kentucke*. His book included one of the first maps of the Commonwealth. The Filson Club has developed an extensive, varied collection of materials on Kentucky, the Upper South, and the Ohio River Valley. This includes a manuscript collection and rare books, periodicals, maps, and other published materials as well as a small museum. From 1926 to 2002 the Filson published a Journal. The Journal appeared under several titles over the years, but for the longest time it was known as the *Filson Club Historical Quarterly*. In 2003 *Ohio Valley History*, jointly published with the Cincinnati Historical Society, replaced the *Quarterly*. The University of Cincinnati joined as a sponsor after publication began.

There is no claim made that this bibliography is complete and includes every reference to the Jackson Purchase. It is based on a review of the online index that is arranged in the order the articles appeared in the *Quarterly*. Each article was searched in the online file to get page numbers. Finally, the online back file of the *Quarterly* was key word searched. I believe this is reasonably complete and I hope it will be useful to those interested in Purchase history. A bibliography for the *Register of the Kentucky Historical Society* follows the bibliography for the *Quarterly*. A bibliography for the *Ohio Valley History* is planned.

The Journal is available on line to members of the Filson Club. A full index is publicly available on the Club's website. A full index to *Ohio Valley History* is also available there. Paper copies of the *Quarterly* are available at a number of libraries in the Purchase region including the McCracken County Public Library, the Pogue Library at Murray State University, and the Meek Library at the University of Tennessee-Martin.
