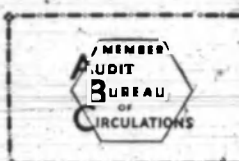

# MURRAY TIGERS TO MEET M'KENZIE

FRIDAY AT 8 P.M.

Clash Will Find Only Two Starters On Local Squad

Murray High School's Tiger gridmen will officially open their 1943 schedule tomorrow (Friday) night at 8:00 when they play host to the McKenzie High eleven of McKenzie, Tenn., in the Ty Holland stadium.

With Dick Hood, fullback, and Tip Miller, halfback, being the only regular starters from the '42 squad, Coach Peyton Holland and Line Coach Crider will place an untied eleven on the field for Friday night's tilt. However, Coach Holland has indicated that although a large number of the boys are inexperienced, they have shown a fine spirit throughout early practices and have developed nicely.

"Naturally," Coach Holland said, "mistakes will be made in tomorrow night's game, a larger number than usual in the opening game, but nevertheless the squad should make a fairly good showing."

The probable Murray lineup as released by Coach Holland this morning, is as follows:

LEFT END—Shroat, letterman, shifted from the backfield.

LEFT TACKLE—Rogers or Carroll. Both to play their first game of football.

LEFT GUARD—Bill Thompson. Capable of developing into a fine man at this post.

CENTER—Doc Stark, letterman, and will be able to take care of the post.

RIGHT GUARD—Murphy. To play in his first ball game.

RIGHT TACKLE—Lee Ross, letterman. Saw action last year and is a mid-season should hit his stride.

RIGHT END—F. Saunders, letterman, who will be attempting to play the big spot left vacant by his brother, Billy Joe Saunders.

QUARTER BACK—Ben Crawford. Will be starting his first ball game. A husky lad that apparently will make the grade this year.

LEFT HALF—Tip Miller, letterman. Perhaps the best ball carrier on the squad and is an excellent passer.

RIGHT HALF—Covington, or Russell. Both lacking in experience but have progressed to a high degree during the practice session. Covington has a nice stride, a good pair of shoulders and should be an outstanding back before the season is over. Russell, however, is no slouch and is giving his opponent a run for the position.

FULLBACK—Dick Hood, captain and letterman. A big lad that will bear watching this year. When Dick finds his own strength he will rank among the top in high school football.

## Small Growers Urged To Pool Sweet Potatoes

Pooling of crops to make up carload lots of sweet potatoes, and sharing of curing and storage facilities were urged this week by the War Food Administration to help dispose of the bumper crop of sweet potatoes that threatens to swamp the market.

To meet the requirements of the government's support price program, sweet potatoes must be delivered in carload lots," said Daniel K. Young, state supervisor of the Food Distribution Administration. "Growers who do not have a large enough crop for a full carload should make arrangements in advance with other growers to pool their potatoes to make a load."

Sweet potatoes must grade US No. 1 and be packed in rigid containers, as well as loaded in cars, to get the support price of \$1.15 per bushel this fall. The support price rises to \$1.50 for cured potatoes in rigid containers in January, and \$1.65 in February and thereafter through the season. Prices for US No. 2 grade with 75 per cent US No. 1 quality will be 15 cents per bushel less than the price for US No. 1. While prices are considerably above the support level now, if a large number of green sweet potatoes are marketed this fall, prices may drop considerably. In that case the growers may wish to take advantage of the government's guarantee, the FDA official pointed out.

Growers were also warned to put in orders for rigid containers early because of the shortage of crates and hampers.

## County Chapter of American Red Cross Has Assisted 460 Local Boys in Armed Forces, Or Families, Since 1941

Since April, 1941, 460 local boys serving in the armed forces or their families here in Calloway county, have been assisted by the Calloway County Chapter of the American Red Cross, according to a statement made today by Mrs. B. Melugin, executive secretary.

The Calloway county chapter has rendered services to the families and dependents of service men in the United States and abroad. For example: A father of two soldiers in the service suffered a stroke. The Red Cross obtained leave for one from the Canal Zone, the other in North Africa was notified through National Red Cross of the father's condition. The soldier from the Canal zone reached the bedside of his father several days before he died.

Another soldier wounded overseas had not heard from home for some months. Through National Red Cross, he was called to his mother's well at home, receiving his mail and writing all the time.

The wife of a sailor was carried to a local hospital. The doctor notified the local chapter. The wife was there and expecting a baby. The sailor was needed at home. The sailor was notified through his Red Cross Field Director and he was granted an emergency furlough.

A soldier in the South Pacific asked the Red Cross to arrange for flowers to be sent to his mother on Mothers Day. The flowers and the boy's message were duly delivered.

The above cases are typical of the 460 cases handled through the chapter since April of 1941. This chapter averages 33 new cases each month. Last month there were 46 new cases.

At press time the news bulletins indicated that the Allied forces were in need of fresh and heavy reinforcements and they were being pushed toward the sea by the heavy savage Nazi encounters. British forces carrying up from Southern Italy stood only 100 miles from making a junction to take some dangerous pressure off the invasion spearhead near Salerno.

A report from London stated that the Nazis were declaring that the Allies were leaving Salerno by ship. The press there did not deny or affirm this German announcement.

Another broadcast stated that the Mediterranean was alive with ships and planes speeding in reinforcements under the direction of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower.

"We are being warned that this war will become bigger and tougher during the long months to come."

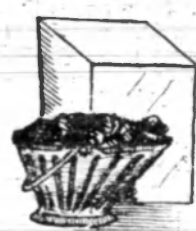

**FUEL OIL.** Period 5 coupons in all states remain good through September 30. Period 1 coupons in new states are good through September 31.

SUGAR Stamp No. 14 good for 5 pounds through October. Stamps Nos. 15 and 16 good for 5 pounds each for home canning purposes through October 31.

SUQES Stamp No. 18 is good for 1 pair through October 31.

**MEATS. FATS.** Red stamps X, Y and Z good through October 2. Brown stamp A becomes good September 12 and remains good through October 2. Brown stamp

**PROCESSED FOODS.**—Blue stamps R, S and T, expire September 20. U, V and W, now good, expire October 20.

**To Start Using Ration Book III**

The first brown "point stamp" in War Ration Book III will become valid September 12. This stamp A is good for 16 points through

October 2. Brown stamps will become valid on successive Sundays and will always expire on the Saturday nearest the end of a month. They will be used for rationing meats, fats, oils, canned fish, cheese, canned milk, and all other commodities now rationed with red stamps in War Ration Book U. 2.

small stamps bearing pictures of field guns, tanks, ships and airplanes are not yet in use. Anyone who has not received Book III may obtain one by applying to his local ration board.
