A reporting system is being in-stalled by the Kentucky State De-partment of Health to obtain a Mass. truer picture of animal diseases in the state, according to L. W. Rowles, D.V.M., Supervisor, Vetrinary Public Health. Dr. Rowles recently with L. Otis Emrk, Ph. D., statis tician with the Communicable Di-sease Center, U. S. Public Health Service, Atlanta, Georgia, about the animal morbidity report. It is hoped that this system will provide meaningful information for prevention and control of these iseases to both public health workers and veterinarians. Reports of actual cases heretfore have often been sporadic and questionable In 1952, rabies was reported in 14 additional counties which show ed no rables in 1951, but there were 30 per cent less animal heads inspected for rabies, denoting a

As 59 counties do not have vet rinarians, the state will be divided into six districts for report ing purposes.




