Report Released On State Farm Cattle
FRANKFORT, Ky., April 14—Cows on Kentucky's institutional farms operated by the Department of Welfare and Mental Health produced 502,108 pounds of milk during March, for an average of 827 pounds per animal.

Butterfat produced averaged 28.9 pounds per cow with 2.53 pounds of milk received per pound of strain fed.
The herd at Kentucky State Hospital, Danville, received the highest rating for the month, producing 87,464 pounds of milk for an average of 940 pounds per cow.

Well Known Local Man Dies Yesterday

Dr. M. E. Woodruff, North 15th street, Murray was claimed by death at the Mid-State Baptist Hospital, Nashville, Tenn., Tuesday at 4 a.m. His death was attributed to pneumonia which developed following a fall two weeks in which he fractured his knee. He was visiting his nephew in Nashville at the time of the accident.

The deceased was 88 years of age and had been active in the religious and educational field all his life. He was reared and educated in West Tennessee. A graduate of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, he served as president of the Hall-Moody Baptist College of Martin, Tenn., and was the Baptist State Evangelist for the state of Tennessee for many years.

Dr. Woodruff had served as superintendent of public schools in Martin, Tenn., Rutherford, Tenn., and Henry county, Tenn. He has also taught special classes at Murray State College.
The Christian man was a member of the First Baptist Church where he taught a Sunday School class for many years. He was active in church work until his illness two weeks ago.

Survivors are five daughters, Mrs. B. Fred Pasmore, Jonesboro, Ark., Mrs. H. Hamblett, Wilmington, Del., Mrs. George Peck, Detroit, Mich., Mrs. Lowell Thompson, Little Rock, Ark., and Mrs. M. O. Thomas, Lafayette, Ind.; two sisters, Mrs. Shobe Smith, Des Moines, Iowa, and Mrs. Ira Haley, Blytheville, Ark.; 12 grandchildren; three great grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted at the First Baptist Church Thursday afternoon at 1 o'clock with Bro. H. C. Chiles, Bro. J. H. Owen and Bro. E. J. Smith officiating. The honorary pallbearers will be members of his Sunday School Class of which Robert Owen is teacher, and also Dr. Rainey T. Wells and Dr. J. W. Carr.

Americans Break Up Chinese Sidown Strike
PUSAN, Korea April 15 (UP)—American soldiers broke up a sidown strike of 745 curly-haired, round-bellied Chinese Communist prisoners today but authorities expected more trouble from the hard-core captives.

The prisoners defied orders to leave the landing ship which had brought them to Pusan harbor from Cheju camp and insisted that Allied officers directing the operation.
They finally formed orderly lines and walked off the ship after American soldiers went aboard wearing gas masks and carrying rifles with fixed bayonets and supplies of tear gas bombs.

Some United Nations officers feared the trouble-making prisoners might try to slow down exchange proceedings scheduled for next Monday at Panmunjom by swapping identification tags.
An officer at the UN truce base at Munsan said he believed the Red prisoners would attempt to thwart or hinder the prisoner exchange plan even though they are expected to be returned to Cheju.
The shipload was the first contingent of a total of 6,033 disabled Red prisoners to be turned over to the Communists at Panmunjom, beginning next Monday.

In Philadelphia, crazy Larry Jansen of the Giants pitched a slick six-hitter to win, 4-1, as Bobby Thomson set him up to a first inning lead with a two-run homer off ace Robin Roberts.

Rookie Bill Burton, 22, yesterday in the majors and two days a hero, hit a 10th inning homer in the inaugural at Milwaukee to give lefty Warren Spahn of the Braves a six-run, 4-2 victory over the St. Louis Cardinals.

"Of course, there's nothing like a race to sharpen a horse for racing," Winfrey admitted. "Still he has grown tremendously over the winter and has been working like a true champion."

## Chilled Crowd Witness Games

NEW YORK, April 15 (UP)—Despite bone-chilling winds and weather more fit for football than baseball, a total of 178,289 fans—38,190 more than turned out last year—witnessed the seven major league openers Tuesday.

The Indians and White Sox drew the largest crowd of the day at Cleveland, 30,000, while the smallest crowd, 18,807, saw the Browns play the Tigers at St. Louis Tuesday night's game.

A crowd of 34,357 saw the Braves play their first game in their Milwaukee home as contested to the 1952 opening day crowd of 4,694 which watched the Braves open at Boston.

The Senator-Red Sox game at Boston Tuesday was postponed because of snow.

At Chicago, Bob Rush gained a sharp eight-hit, 3-2 victory over the Reds when Randy Jackson denied home two runs in the eighth inning off lefty Ken Raffensberger, who generally subdues Chicago without trouble.

But it was the "Lad" by Lemon that gave fans the most to talk about. The no-hit pressure went off in the first inning when Minnie Miñoso singled cleanly but thereafter Chicago got nothing, hitting only three balls out of the infield. Lemon, who had a no-hitter in 1948, just missed duplicating the achievement of his team mate, Bobby Feller, who pitched the only opening day no-hitter in 1940, also against the White Sox.

All Milwaukee was "rootin' for Burton as the Negro kid slammed the victory homer in the 10th to go along with his first day's shining feat of two hits, the first major league run to be scored, a clean base and six fine catches in the outfield.
