Board Recommends Acceptance

Swedish Firm Offers To Buy Tappan

The Tappan Co. and Aktiebolaget Electrolux, a Swedish Corporation, announced Thursday afternoon that in accordance with an agreement in principal entered into by the two companies, a wholly owned U.S. subsidiary, AB Electrolux, would make a cash tender offer for any and all of the outstanding common shares of Tappan at \$18 per share and the Tappan Board has recommended acceptance by Tappan shareholders.

It is intended that the tender offer will commence after definitive documents containing all of the terms and conditions of the offer are filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission. Such filing is expected to be made today. (AB Electrolux is not affiliated with, and should not be confused with, the Electrolux Division of Consolidated Foods Corp., a Maryland corporation, which manufactures and distributes a popular brand of household vacuum cleaner in the U.S.)

The offer is expected to remain open for 10 days although payment for the tendered shares can not be made until expiration of the waiting periods required by the Hart-Scott-Rodino Anti-Trust Improvements Act of 1976.

Among other conditions to the payment for tendered shares, AB Electrolux must obtain approval for the transaction from the Swedish National

With respect to the offer W. R. Tappan, chairman of the Tappan board, stated that "We are enthusiastic about Tappan's potential affliation with AB Electrolux which will greatly enhance our opportunities for growth and Tappan will continue to be managed by its present officers as a separate subsidiary"

Tappan further indicated that it was his view that the proposed affliation 'will serve the best interests of the company and it shareholeders as well as those of its employees and

AB Electrolux is a Swedish company, the parent of a world-wide group of

companies which engages in the manufacture and sale of a wide range of products, including, household appliances, industrial and office products and power saws and which provides commercial cleaning services.

"I think this is an opportunity for a larger capital based corporation to hopefully improve our growth and expansion in this country," E. J. Haverstock, local plant general manager and a Tappan vice president,

"We don't expect any impact on this plant or our employees at all at this time," Haverstock added.

AB Electrolux also owns the Eureka Corporation of Bloomington, Ill., a company known locally for its line of vacuum cleaners and other household

The possibility that Tappan would be sold was revealed in a press release from the company's headquarters in Mansfield, Ohio last week.

At that time, a spokesman for Tappan in Mansfield pointed out that "no formal offer" had vet been made and that the "other company has stated that it would only proceed on a basis acceptable to it and to the management of

Carl C. Icahn, Tappan's largest shareholder, was quoted in The Wall Street Journal as saying he is "quite pleased" about the talks. "I've felt all along that a merger is what this company should enter into," he said.

Icahn was elected a director at the company's annual meeting last spring, defeating a management candidate in a proxy fight. He pledged at the time to attempt to convince other directors to hire an investment banking firm to solicit acquisition proposals.

Icahn and Icahn & Co. of New York,

of which he is president and 80 percent owner, own more than 322,000 of Tappan's 3.1 million common shares outstanding.

In 1979's second quarter Tappan had a net income of about \$2 million or 57 cents a share fully diluted, up 62 percent from the year-earlier \$1.2 million, or 36 cents a share, according to the Journal. Sales rose 11 percent to \$70.9

In the first half the appliance maker had a profit of \$2.8 million, or 85 cents a share fully diluted, on sales of \$136.2 million, up from year-earlier net of \$1.4 million or 45 cents a share on sales of \$117.3 million.

Profit for the 1978 periods was reduced by losses from operations that have since been discontinued.

Tappan shares closed at 1534 on the New York Stock Exchange at the end of trading Thursday.

Henley had told the council in July, following a ruling against the city on a right-of-way suit, that the \$109,000 had been withdrawn by the governor and was no longer available.

"This letter (the one from Grayson) could be interpreted that I had lied to the council," Henley said, adding that he wrote Grayson a return letter requesting verification of the funding before proceeding on the matter.

Grayson subsequently wrote to the mayor (in a letter dated Oct. 4, 1979) and said:

"Apparently my letter of September 12, 1979, led to some confusion relative to the availability of \$109,000 for this

"My staff again checked and found that the money was not transferred to the Department of Transportation and, therefore, never existed in the Department's account. At this time, the funds are not available from the Department of Transportation for the Glendale Road project. »

"I apologize if my earlier letter was confusing and hope that this will clarify the matter.

Henley told the council that it was possible the Sept. 12 letter was "an honest mistake. . . Secretary Grayson (may have) felt the money was there.

"Or it's also possible that some local person who seems to have a back-door contact in DOT was trying to set me up," Henley said, in a reference to a copy of another letter that had been sent to him by DOT. That letter, which

Candy Quarantine To Be Lifted

company is "permanently enjoined from operating or maintaining their manufacturing establishment in any manner which is violative of the provisions of Chapter 217 of Kentucky Revised Statutes or the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder by the Department for Human Resources of the Commonwealth for Kentucky.'

John Draper, manager of the Food Control Branch of the Department for Human Resources, was not available for comment concerning any action by the state. Terry Morrison, department attorney who signed the complaint by general counsel Marvin O'Koon against the Almo candy company, refused to comment on Lassiter's decision.

The candy in question was manufactured at the Almo company under alleged conditions that resulted in a circuit court restraining order against all operations of the company and its owner, Floyd Nixon.

The restraining order, that was lifted Sept. 20, was the result of the complaint filed Aug. 29 by O'Koon and Morrison in Calloway Circuit Court. The complaint was made after a state inspection of the Almo facility

The complaint alleged that the candy company has "consistently and

Enrollment For City Schools Totals 1,647

The enrollment for the Murray Independent School System stands at 1.647 at the conclusion of the first month of the 1979-80 year according to a report given to school board members Thursday night by Superintendent Robert Glin Jeffrey.

The number of students in the system_ has declined 179 since the 1978-79 school year when 1,826 students were registered. Enrollment reached a peak in 1976-77 with the enrollment of 1,943 students, followed by 1,862 in 1977-78.

Students in kindergarten through grade four number 572, as compared to 642 last year. A breakdown of this figure shows that Robertson Elementary School, which houses kindergarten through grade two, has 329 students this year. Last year, 392 students were enrolled. There are 243 students in grades three and four in Carter Elementary, seven less than the number enrolled last year.

Murray Middle School has 496 students enrolled, as compared to 521 last year. There was a decline of 84 students, from 663 in the 1978-79 year to 579 this school year, at Murray High School.

The board voted to sign contracts for 63 students living in the city school district who wish to attend the Calloway County School System.

Jeffrey informed board members that he had received approval of the system's plan to correct deficiencies

following the state fire marshal's inspection. The system must be brought into compliance prior to the beginning of the 1980-81 school year.

A change was made in the system's policy concerning the retirement system for members of the classified staff. According to the policy which took effect July 1, 1976, the system pays into the retirement system for employees who have been employed for 10

The change calls for the system to pay into the fund for new employees if they have been on the retirement system elsewhere for 10 months. For employees on the program less than 10 months with another employer, the system will pay when their previous employment and employment with the system totals 10 months.

A maintenance agreement for temperature control with Robertshaw Inc. was approved by the board. The \$1,860 contract calls for inspections two times a year.

The board added Dr. "Jonquelyn Simpson Duke and Mrs. Ann Watson to the substitute teacher list. Dr. Duke is certified to teach kindergarten through grade eight, while Mrs. Watson is an elementary or high school librarian and mathematics teacher.

The next board meeting date was changed to Tuesday, Oct. 23, in the library of Carter Elementary. The board will convene following a meeting from 7-8:30 p.m. - with 'Carter's teachers.

Fiscal Court Spends \$369,527 On Road Upkeep Since July 1

A total of \$369,527 has been spent on the upkeep of county roads since July 1 according to a report given the Calloway County Fiscal Court at its meeting Thursday afternoon.

County judge-executive Robert O. Miller told the magistrates that the figure represented more than the quarterly allowance for the road fund. Each magistrate shall choose three roads in his district which he feels are most in need of gravel and submit the list to road supervisor Carroll Guy.

Several county residents attended the meeting to request road upkeep or traffic control devices. A petition was presented to the court from residents of the Headley Swift Road and the Duncan Creek Road asking for the upgrading of the roads. Requests were also made for gravel on the Watts-Patterson Landing Road and Farmer's Road.

Phil Bryan, a resident of the Lynn Grove Highway (Highway 94 East) near Johnny Robertson Road (Highway 1660), asked the court to notify the state of the need for some type of traffic control device because of the number of accidents which occur at this intersection. Three serious accidents have happened in the last 90 days.

Miller will ask the state department of highways to install either a yellow east-west light or a red light at the north-south part of the intersection. Another alternative presented was installing a surface warning signal similar to that used on toll roads when approaching toll gates. This signal could be installed north of Highway 94. County attorney Max Parker told the

court that it is his opinion that a road between lots five and six in the Kirksey Subdivision had not been accepted by the county and, therefore, the county has no jurisdiction to close it. A petition had earlier been presented

to the court by Rollie Henson to close the road. John Tucker protested the closing claiming that the county had never accepted the road for maintenance.

It was also noted that county coroner Tommy Walker has passed the state Medical Examiner Program making him eligible for a monthly pay increase from \$175 to \$325.

East has to be wide awake to beat today's touchy game. If he makes a routine play, declarer will slide off with his game. If he - • Q 8 3 asks himself. "Why is declarer playing as he is?" he will increase his chances of finding the winner.

West leads three high spades and South ruffs the third round. With two tricks gone to the defense. South's obvious problem is how to avoid losing two club tricks.

Had dummy's trump spots been better, declarer might have found two or more entries to try two club finesses. With only one dummy entry, declarer had to try to force a defender into an embarrassing lead.

After ruffing the third spade, declarer cashed his trump king and his two high diamonds. Next, he led a trump to dummy's ace and led a low club. What should East play?

If East plays routinely and follows suit with his. seven, declarer will play his nine and the defense would be trapped. West would win his queen, but would have no safe lead. A club return would give up a free finesse and a spade and a diamond would offer a ruff and discard.

East saves the game if he plays his club king when the low club is led from dummy. If declarer ducks, East is on lead and he can lead another club safely. If



Modern Motor Milestones

Introduction: Sometimes medical journals contain articles that are so thought-provoking that they deserve a wider audience. Hence, we take this opportunity to present "Modern Motor Milestones," an editorial by Dr. Lawrence R. Berger of the University of Washington, reprinted in its entirety from the December 1978 issue of Pediatrics (Vol. 62, No. 6), with permission of the author and publisher.

In child development circles, a motor milestone is a discrete event in a person's progressive mastery of control over the body's movements. To most parents, each milestone - sitting up without support, grasping a raisin between thumb and forefinger, holding a cup, taking the first step all by herself
— is a joyous occasion in their child's life. Children of the seventies, however, exhibit a new set of motor milestones made possible by our affluent society. None of these is cause for celebration. The modern milestones are discrete events marking the child's progressive involvement with engine-driven

As early as 4 years of age, children may ride their first minibike. For kids, the minibike is plenty maxi, reaching speeds up to 80 kph (50 mph) with engines of 1 to 4 hp. With a wheel diameter less than 25 cm (10 in) and a seat height under 64 cm (25 in), the minibikes are marketed as children's "toys," despite their adult-sized hazards. The minibikes are usually the first of several other motor achievements. Trailbikes are popular with the elementary school set. Astride a trailbike, 10-year-olds roar down hills in clouds of dust, turn wheelies on graveled pavement, and leap deep gullies in a single bound. Motorboats provide a last frontier of laissez-faire: Anyone old enough to hold a wheel is free to cavort in America's waterways without traffic cops, stop signs, or any other burdensome government regulation. Should our driven and driving children be faced with inclement weather, snowmobiles provide a perfect escape from the dreariness of self-propulsion. The pinnacle of motor development? Their own car, or better yet, motorcycle, made available to them two to five years before legal drinking age through the good graces of driver education.

Why should a pediatrician be complaining about all this good clean fun? For 1976, the U.S. Coast Guard reported 11 boating deaths resulting from motorboat accidents in which the operator was 12 years of age or younger. 1 Children under the age of 14 accounted for 21 per cent of the estimated 13,361 snowmobile injuries in 1977, and 51 percent of the 19,120 injuries from unlicensed motorbikes (motor scooters, minibikes, etc.). 2 I've seen enough third-degree burns from gasoline explosions and multilations from motorized vehicle accidents to last me a lifetime. Sure, kids are hurt while bicycle riding and cross-country skiing. But to motorize bikes and skis is homicidal for kids. How many kids, after a spill from a minibike, have needed skin grafts because their legs were ground into the pavement by spinning chain-driven wheels? Bicycles don't do that. Not only are the injuries from minibike accidents more severe, but minibikes cause four times as many accidents per vehicle as do bicycles. What excuse do we as a society have for bringing the injury-and deathassociated dangers of motorcycles including high speeds, motor-driven moving parts, and gasoline engines to children, who lack both the maturity of judgment and the "motor skills" to control these vehicles?

There are other reasons for justified exasperation. Not only the excitement of high speeds gets into kids' blood the effuvia from a forest of tailpipes does also. I doubt that tetraethyllead, sulfur dioxide, and carbon monoxide from a weekend of trail-biking or snowmobiling enhances a child's learning capacity. That the stuff is not recommended for healthy lungs, there's no question.

What of the values that our motorhungry children are imbibing? Speed and power, not esthetics or selfachievement, are the important goals. Independence and autonomy, not sharing and cooperation, are stressed. Terrorizing other people is more fun than interacting constructively with them. High-priced activities, like steering a motorboat or bouncing on a

snowmobile, are exciting; inexpensive pursuits, like hiking or swimming, are dull. Environments are prized according to the availability of roads to haul minibikeladen trailers and fuel stations to feed gasoline tanks. Tranquility, isolation, and natural beauty become quaint irrelevancies. Rather than drawing closer to the earth, appreciating its smells and sights and sounds through nonconsumptive and nondestructive pursuits, the object is to get across territory in the fastest, loudest, and scariest way possible.

Finally, how much can a family share when all its members are driving off in different directions on their own vehicles? If parents bought their kids skis instead of snowmobiles, bicycles instead of trailbikes, the money saved could pay for more life-enhancing motor activities - dance classes or piano lessons, for instance. Better yet, parents might save enough money to be able to spend a few extra nights or weekends with their children, skiing, walking, or just talking with each other. Kids might discover that their parents are more interesting people than they suspected, and parents might find that their children have much to teach

If I had my way, child-sized motor vehicles simply wouldn't be manufactured. Just as many states have outlawed the sale of dangerous fireworks, so, too, could federal or state legislation forbid the sale of these vehicles. Even without additional legislation, the Consumer Product Safety Commission has the power to recall and ban hazardous products. Perhaps if they received enough letters from physicians treating children with motor-vehicle related injuries, they'd be prompted to act. Finally, no person should be allowed to pilot any motor driven vehicle - on or off public roads or across waterways or in the air without a license.

Until these vehicles are no longer available to children, we as pediatricians can provide anticipatory guidance to parents, to steel them for the inevitable demands of their children for these "presents." Children will not become demoralized if they're demotorized, nor will they be emotionally or physically deprived. Just as toddlers will desert their fancy 'educational' toys for hours of blissful play with battered pots and pans, so will our adolescents find more gratifying, and safer, pursuits. What's required is for parents to stop living out their fantasies, expiating their guilt, or avoiding their responsibilities by lavishing on their children spiritstifling, environment-destroying, hazardous, and expensive "toys."

Philippians 2:1-11

Grieved by a report of a lack of complete harmony in the fellowship of the church at Philippi, Paul made a strong plea to them for mutual love. The mere threat of disunity in their fellowship was a matter of great concern to the Apostle, who was so anxious to avert the disruption of the Lord's

The Exhortation — Philippians 2:1-4

Each of the four grounds on which Paul's exhortation to unity is based is in the form of a conditional clause, which assumes that the condition is true. The first ground on which his appeal was based was the stimulus in Christ (2:1a). Right relationship to Christ stimulates the soul to the noblest efforts in Christian service. The second ground was the incentive of love (2:1b). The love of Christ flowing to the heart of a believer should be a sufficient incentive to live for Him. The third ground of appeal was the fellowship of the Holy Spirit (2:1c). When Christians are controlled and led by the Holy Spirit, they are free from bickering and strife, and their hearts are filled with compassion, and their chief interest is in living to please and glorify God. The fourth ground of appeal was compassion in the heart (2:1d). God's children should manifest affection for, sympathy with, and compassion toward others.

Anxious to keep ambition and vanity from destroying the harmony of this splendid church, which he loved so dearly, Paul stressed the tremendous value of humility and unselfishness on the part of the members. He urged the members to lose themselves in the service of others.

The Example -

Philippians 2:5-11

Paul challenged the Philippians to imitate Christ in their way of thinking Christians, who have the "mind" or "disposition" of Christ, are disposed to think, to speak, and to act as Christ did. Christlike living is pleasing unto God. It pleases God because it is characterized by eminent humility, sublime benevolence, and supreme devotion.

Certainly Paul could not have used a better and stronger argument for following Christ than the example of the Saviour, Who divested Himself of the glories of heaven, voluntarily humbled Himself and came to live in the midst of sinful people, made Himself of no reputation, took upon Himself the form of a servant, and died on the cross for the benefit of all those who would believe on Him. If we have his mind, we will not seek our own wills, but His: we will not strive unduly for our own ad-

vancement, but for His glory. After Christ accomplished the work which He came to do, God not only raised Him from the dead, but He exalted Him to the highest place. welcomed Him to the glory which He had shared with Him before the world was, and gave Him a name which is above every name. Blessed be that name! It denotes all that He is now known to be. He stands alone, unique,

A glorious triumph awaits our blessed Lord when every tongue shall confess that He is more than man, that He is truly Christ and Lord "to the glory of God the Father."

Yes, it is legal for Medicare to refuse to reimburse an individual for 80 percent of the allowable charges if those charges are from a nonparticipating nursing facility. It does not matter how many nurses are on duty or how accredited the institution is. The facility must participate with Medicare or you are not eligible for reimbursement from Medicare.

Before you completely condemn Medicare and the government, keep it in mind that it is possible that your fully accredited institution which offers outstanding care and five times the number of RNs, may be nonparticipating with Medicare simply because the administration of that skilled nursing facility chose not to. If your freedom of choice is therefore denied, it could be because the nursing facilities in your area chose to exercise their freedom of choice - not to participate with Medicare.

We have found in many cases, skilled nursing homes are quite quick to throw the blame at Uncle Sam and his bureaucratic red tape, when in fact tha. facility had other possibly selfish reasons for not wanting to participate with Medicare.

We also want to point out that even though your local skilled nursing facilities do not participate in Medicare, you would be eligible for certain coverage under Part "B" of Medicare, such as doctor visits, while in a skilled nursing facility. At any rate, we hope that you will be

able to find a suitable skilled nursing facility that participates with Medicare somewhere in your general area. You

Redpath Chautauqua held its second meet during the summer for a seven day program with tent set again on the athletic field of Murray High School. Series Evened After Sanguillen's Heroics

BALTIMORE - The two men involved in one of baseball's most unusual trades combined Thursday night to tie the 1979 World Series between the Pittsburgh Pirates and Baltimore Orioles at 1-1.

Manny Sanguillen, 35, ripped a single to right, scoring catcher Ed Ott with the winning run in the top of the ninth to give the Pittsburgh Pirates a 3-2 victory over the Baltimore Orioles.

Only two years ago, the Pirates felt the aging Sanguillen from Panama was expendable. They shipped him and a reported \$100,000 to Oakland for A's Manager Chuck Tanner, who replaced the late Danny Murtaugh as Pittsburgh

It isn't everyday you see a player traded for a manager.

The Pirates, however, hadn't forgotten Sanguillen was an intregal part of their last World Series team in

After one season in Oakland, Pittsburgh reacquired Sanguillen for three players. He was relegated to bullpen work and pinch-hitting.

"Anything we do in this Series," said Sanguillen in his halting English, "we are doing for (the late) Roberto Clemente.

Clemente is a Hall of Fame outfielder who was the most valuable player in the 1971 Series for the Pirates in a sevengame triumph over Baltimore. He died in a plane crash while on a mercy mission Dec. 31, 1972.

Sanguillen said. "My hit — all I do to help the ball club win - is for him."

After Clemente's plane crashed, Sanguillen personally made dives into the ocean, looking for his friend and teammate. Finally, friends convinced Sanguillen that his plunges into the choppy water were too dangerous.

"If Roberto was alive, he might be a coach or a manager, but he is still with us. God took him away from us. That is the way life is and it will happen to us all some time. But I still have Roberto

In the ninth inning Thursday night, with rain sweeping across Memorial Stadium, Tanner called upon the craggy veteran who had helped make a Tanner dream come true.

ever since he was a boy in New Castle, Pa., near Pittsburgh.

The Pirates had runners at first and second with two out and the score tied 2-2 on the cold, wet night. Tanner told Sanguillen to grab a bat and go out to face ace Orioles reliever Dan

The Pittsburgh runners were Ott, who had singled, and Phil Garner, who had walked. Stanhouse went to one ball and two strikes on Sanguillen before he threw a pitch out of the strike zone.

Sanguillen, one of the best bad-ball hitters in baseball during his prime, still swings at anything he can reach. He slammed the outside pitch on a line to right for a single.

Ott never stopped as he lit out from

Orioles catcher Rick Dempsey on a relay from outfielder Ken Singleton.

In the bottom of the ninth, Pirates reliever Kent Tekulve, who saved 31

games during the regular season, came in and did his act. He retired the side in order, striking out two, and the Pirates

Memories In Mind

Sanguillen Hopes '79 Series Devoted To The Late Clemente

AP Special Correspondent BALTIMORE .-"I carry the memory of Roberto Clemente in my heart," said Manny Sanquillen, sweat dripping from his shaggy black beard and another kind of water oozing from his flashing dark eyes. "I dedicate, my winning hit to Roberto. I hope we play the whole series for Roberto."

Baseball is a sentimental game and sentiment prevailed Thursday night when this 35year-old third-string catcher with an anemic .230 batting average was called out of the bullpen to strike the blow that sends the 1979 World Series to Pittsburgh tied at a game apiece with the Baltimore Orioles.

His ninth-inning, two-out single to right scored Ed Ott from second with the run that gave the Pirates a rain-

drenched 3-2-victory. "Roberto, he was always an inspiration for me," the benchwarmer said afterward. "I never forget the 1971 World Series. Roberto, he tells everybody, 'Get us in the World Series and I hit .400 and win it for you.' That's what he

The 1971 Series between career. these same two teams went seven games, with the Pirates rallying from an 0-2 deficit to win it. Clemente batted .414. hit two home runs and pulled off spectacular fielding plays to dominate the series.

It became known as the 'Roberto Clemente Series.' Spurred by his baseball idol, a younger Sanguillen himself got 11 hits in the series and batted .379.

Fourteen months later, the talented Clemente died in a plane crash carrying supplies to victims of the Nicarauguan earthquake.

"I work for the Lord," he says softly to waves of reporters seeking more baseball details. "I pray before every game. I pray none of us get hurt. I pray that we win this one for Roberto."

The aging Panamanian catcher fails to get upset when the post-game grilling turns to questions about his reputation for swinging at bad balls, the fact he played in only 56 games this season and batted in only four runs - not counting the most important

Racers Hope To Retain OVC Lead With Victory Over 0-4 Raiders

Austin Peay's football fortunes didn't seem to be particularly bright when it began its 1977 football season. The Governors had finished just 5-6 and 3-4 in the Ohio Valley Conference the previous year, and with a new coach in his first season, a rebuilding period was the logical guess.

Happily for Peay fans, that new coach, James "Boots" Donnelly, proceded to guide Austin Peay to an 8-3 record and an OVC title, the first in Governor history.

Now Donnelly is in his first year as head coach at Middle Tennessee, his alma mater, but the script has turned a bit sour. The Blue Raiders, 0-4 heading into Saturday's 1:30 p.m. homecoming game with Murray State at Horace Jones Field in Murfreesboro, are strug-

"I'm certainly not used to it (the losing), Donnelly said by phone this morning. "We survived at Austin Peay with a few upperclassmen who had some get-up-and-go about them. We don't have many of those people here."

Donnelly isn't even using many of the upperclassmen he has. Of the 11 starters on defense, an amazing nine are freshmen, which explains, in part, why Middle has allowed its opponents a weighty 417 yards a game.

And it lost to Eastern Kentucky, one of the kingpins of the OVC, 52-10 last week. Those two factors, then, would seem to hint that Middle Tennessee will be an easy foe for Murray State. But Racer coach Mike Gottfried gives no such indication

"We weren't involved in many big games last season, but every game is a big one for us this year." he said. And as the OVC leader with a 2-0 mark, the Racers need a victory to enter the Oct. 27 contest against Eastern Kentucky unbeaten in conference play.

"I feel about the same as all 0-4 coaches do," said Donnelly, who is as known for his clever responses to questions as he is for his coaching ability. "The sun don't shine on the same dog

Middle stayed within 7-3 of Eastern Kentucky through one quarter, but its hopes were dashed over the next two periods, in which the Colonels exploded for 38 points.

"We didn't play that badly on offense against them," said Donnelly. "Most people feel like you can't run on Eastern, but I think we did a pretty good job of it."

Murray easily top the OVC in rushing defense, allowing a scarce 69.5 yards a game. But Donnelly doesn't necessarily feel the Racers' wide-tackle six defensive alignment dictates the pass.

"I ran it (the wide tackle) in high school, so I'm pretty familiar with it," he said. "Our biggest problem will be dealing with all those crazy defensive schemes Murray runs, but you won't see one of those 40 to 45 passes thrown days from our quarterbacks."

What passing the Blue Raiders do wil likely be carried out by Brown Sanford, a freshman from Oakland High School in Murfreesboro. He ranks third in the OVC in passing, having hit on 31 of 63 passes for 486 yards and four touchdowns. Bruce Bryant, Middle's senior tight end, has caught 12 of them,

including one for a touchdown. The offense, then, doesn't worry Donnelly nearly as much as the defense and its ballooning statistics. "You can't win in this league without the big D." he said. "That's what makes Murray so tough. Their defense has improved tremendously, and you notice they're winning now.

The Racers are in better shape personnel-wise with the return of tailback Danny Lee Johnson and tight end Kris Robbins, both of whom missed

the UT-Martin game due to injuries. Lindsey Hudspeth is the likely starter at tailback, but Johnson should see plenty of action.

Fullback Tony Lester was in on a play or two against Martin before leaving the game when a knee injury flared up, but he surprised the Racer coaches with a quick recovery and is a likely

Lawson has been a member in the English department since 1970, having received her doctorate from Tulane University. She is presently director of the department's lower division, freshman and sophomore, studies. She was aided in her research by a grant from the Committee on Institutional Research at Murray State and spent more than two years in research on the life and writings of Irvin S.

Cobb wrote some 65 books and published many stories in the Saturday Evening Post and other popular magazines of the time. He was also well known as a journalist, especially for his coverage of the first World War.

According to Dr. Lawson, Cobb objected to the 'Magnolia-blossom school of Southern literature, in which all Southerners were depicted either as mint-julep drinking squires or poor white trash. Thus one of Cobb's chief concerns in his stories was to reproduce with accuracy the lives and human concerns of the people of the region."

Cella was also helped by a grant from the MSU Committee on Institutional Research and spent some of his time in Virginia with the collection of works, papers and diaries of Virginia-born Mary Johnston (1870-1936), whose most popular works were historical novels.

Her best-selling novel was published in 1900. Also popular among her 25 books were two novels of the Civil War, "The Long Roll," and "Cease Firing," which were praised for their historical accuracy.

Dr. Cella say's that Miss Johnston's works were "somewhat old-fashioned even in her day" and yet 'surprisingly modern' in their reflection of such interests as the status of women and mysticism. Their greatest significance today, according to Cella, results from Miss Johnston's deep interest in the social and political history of her native region.

Wylder received research grants from Colorado State University and Southwest State University which helped wrote two novels about the South but whose most popular works were Westerns.

Hough's most famous novel was "The Covered Wagon," which was made into a very successful "silent movie," although the movie did have a musical soundtrack. Hough also worte other Westerns, such as "North of 36" and a number of historical novels, among them his best-sellers "The Mississippi Bubble" and '54-40 or Fight.







Butcher Advises Brown Not To Make Tax Returns Public

John Y. Brown Jr. says he was leaning toward making public his income tax returns until he was strongly advised against it by another multimillionaire Democractic candidate for governor - Jake Butcher of Tennessee.

Brown said Butcher told him of being besieged by crank callers voicing threats and trying to extort money. The nuisance continued after Butcher's defeat this year in the general election, the Kentucky Democratic

gubernatorial nominee said. Butcher told me he would just as soon let those crazy peoople think that everything he had was tied up in trust,' he said in an interview.

Management of hazardous

Associated Press Writer FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) -The attorney general's office says two state agencies have power to regulate the transportation of hazardous waste

and materials in Kentucky. It said Thursday that the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Protection can supervise hazardous waste and the Department of Transportation can handle hazardous materials.

"It must be kept clear that hazardous wastes and hazardous materials are not necessarily the same thing,' Assistant Attorney Dale Brodkey said.

She advised Ed Hancock, deputy transportation secretary for legal affairs, that "hazardous material" is not defined in any statutes or regulations.

"We recommend that DOT (the transportation agency) set out a definition or state explicity that it is incorporating a definition from another source such as a federal law," Ms. Brodkey said.

She said "hazardous waste" is clearly defined in Kentucky

"There will be some overlap in the extent of regulatory authority of the two departments where the definitions overlap," Ms. Brodkey said. Neither department has as of yet promulgated regulations in this area.'

Ms. Brodkey suggested that the environmental and transportation departments work out for themselves the specific regulations to avoid duplication.

A Commission on Hazardous Waste Management is expected to make recommendations to Gov. Julian Carroll on specific bills.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has estimated that two thirds of the hazardous generated in this country originate in 10 states and that half of these states border on Kentucky

Kentucky is ranked in the top 20 states in the volume of hazardous waste generated within its borders.

Ms. Brodkey told Hancock that Kentucky law does not specifically say the natural resources department shall draw up regulations dealing with transportation of hazardous wstes.

But she said a system of permits is established which includes a proposed method of transportation. The assistant attorney

general said that although some recent changes in the law suggest that the General Assembly meant to remove the natural resources agency's power over waste transportation, "the attorney general's office thinks otherwise.

She said the Legislature often simply does not have the time or expertise to set out in detail an agency's functions and powers in the statutes which create the department. Ms. Brodkey murcated that

the transportation agency could regulate hazardous materials in part by its current power to require shipping documents to be carried on vehicles and be made available for inspection.

UNITED NATIONS (AP) - Fidel Castro emerged from almost 36 hours within the iron security of the Cuban Mission today and rode by car to the United Nations to report on the stormy Havana summit of nonaligned countries and address the economic issues dividing the world's rich and poor.

The bearded Cuban president, wearing his customary green fatigue uniform, was greeted at the delegates' entrance by U.N. Secretary-General Kurt Waldheim, who escorted him to the secretary-general's 38th-floor office

Dollar Climbs To Highest Point Of Year Against Yen

By The Associated Press The U.S. dollar climbed to its highest point of the year against the Japanese yen today as interest rates continued to rise sharply. Stock prices opened higher as activity on Wall Street continued to calm after a wild slide early in

The dollar rose in Tokyo to 226.85 yen. up from 225.90 the day before, and it also strengthened against other major currencies. The Japanese economy is being buffeted by a wave of inflation brought on in part by higher oil prices.

The U.S. Treasury Department on Thursday sold longterm bonds with a yield of more than 10 percent for the first time ever. The bonds, which mature in 15 years and one month, brought an average yield of 10.17

Henley passed out to the council along with the others, had been sent to fourth. In another matter, councilman Steve Sammons questioned the validity of the city's share of joint city-county projects such as the ambulance service, the park and the airport.

Sammons said that with city residents paying both city and county property taxes, anytime the city and county both pay subsidies to a joint operation, the city taxpayer is paying three-fourths of the total while the county taxpayer is paying only one-

Sammons based his estimate on the projection that approximately one-half of the tax money received by the Calloway County Fiscal Court comes from county residents who live within the city and also pay Murray property

"To be fair to the people of Murray we should strive to get a better deal with the county," Sammons said.

"We've been rebuffed consistently when we've asked the county or help in road repair," Mayor Henley said. The council has authorized a \$30,000

subisidy and the fiscal court has authorized a \$45,000 subsidy to support an ambulance service based in the Murray-Calloway County Hospital. The hospital board is expected to consider the offers at its meeting Thursday, Oct.

The current city-county contract with Mercy Ambulance Service expires at the end of this year.

Official documents revealed that Stuart and Feldhouse conducted similar analyses with similar findings concerning foreign matter found.

However, Stuart said he also tested for total microbial count per gram, staphylococcus count, coliform count and salmonella-shigella count. He reported from his findings that he

felt the product is safe for human consumption. Stuart added, in his opinion, it was not possible to draw a conclusion of human health from examinations made by Feldhouse. As a guideline, Stuart said he

followed limitations set for frozen desserts and ice cream for his pathogenic testing on the candy. The limitations are published in "Basic Microbiology with Applications," by Brock and Brock. He added he could not find standards for candies.


