Experiment In Tuberculosis Announced

NEW YORK 10 — An experiment in the relation of poor nutrition to tuberculosis has unexpectedly produced evidence of a hidden and unknown ingredient in cod liver oil which has a healing effect within the human body.

Dr. Horace R. Getz, of a TB sanitarium at Altadena, Calif., took a group of new patients who because of low concentrations of vitamins A and C in their blood seemed to have been in a poor nutritional state when they contracted the disease.

Rather than using the new "miracle" anti-tuberculosis drug, Dr. Getz started out by treating them in the traditional way — bed rest. All were given a nourishing basic diet. About one third were given synthetic vitamin A in tablet form. A second sub-group was given cod liver oil because it contains vitamin A. The third group was given vitamin C.

Getz wanted to see how the bodies of each group fought the TB bug in comparison with the other two groups.

Cod Liver Oil Results Good
The patients who got the synthetic vitamin A didn't do any better than the patients who got their only vitamins from their diets. Among these two groups, TB is caused by bacteria — the tubercle bacilli. Isoniazid prevents them from growing and multiplying. In many cases, however, the bacilli have become "resistant" to isoniazid. The reason they have, the Youmans reported, is because

some strains of bacilli are not exuding a chemical substance which prevents isoniazid from preventing their growth and multiplication. The Youmans don't know yet the nature of this substance. It may be a protein but it may also be an enzyme. Even more oddly, strains of bacilli which were susceptible to isoniazid seemed to give more of the substance than strains which were entirely resistant. They warned that no conclusions should be drawn at this time.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Keep cut flowers fresh by adding a lump of sugar or camphor to the water.

Slagger baking pans on the oven rack to provide the best circulation and least consumption of heat.

The best time to pick flowers is in the early morning or late evening while the petals and leaves are moist. Keep cut flowers away from drafts and sun to prolong their life.

To brighten a rug, sprinkle salt on it before running the vacuum sweeper.

An ice cube wrapped in a piece of cloth is handy for moistening glue on stamps and envelopes.

Clean flower vases quickly and thoroughly with hot water and vinegar or household ammonia.

Don't use ammonia, ammonia compounds or other strong alkalis on rugs and carpets. They may cause bleeding of dyes and even may damage wool fibers.

Hang a pin cushion conveniently inside a closet, if you use pins to fasten skirts or other apparel on clothes hangers.

To remove rust from the corners of cake tins in use a long time, dip a raw potato in cleaning powder and scour.

For a tight? wrap on a package, dampen the string before use. The string shrinks as it dries.

When greasing muffin tins, be sure to wipe the excess fat from each cup. A too heavy coating of fat causes uneven rising of the muffin batter.
