Fired electronically, the rockets from this pod cover an area larger than a football field, and each rocket is powerful enough to knock down the biggest of bombers. The Scorpion can fire 104 of these 2.75-inch air-to-air rockets. The pods are mounted on the plane's wingtips. U. S. Air Force planes in the Arctic area are receiving these pods.


