Senator Fulbright is an outspoken foe of the Eisenhower Administration foreign policy as it has been run almost exclusively by Secretary of State John Foster Dulles. He has spoken out on occasion against the Dulles "brink of war" philosophy. He favors closer, and more aggressive negotiations, with the Soviet Union, believing we are going to have to live permanently in the same world with Communists and that it is high time we begin employing our initiative and intelligence to establish formulas for world peace that will be acceptable to both

Foreign relations is, of course, nothing new. What is new is relations with Communism because it is new, Being a revolutionary philosophy it is based on fear and hate. If these can be countered Communism will fall of its own weight, and if we believe in the Christian religion we must believe there are ways to overcome them short

of war.

Sometimes it may appear that Communism is spreading, but this could easily be the death struggle of evil forces everywhere. People are learning that it is a failure, not only in Russia where it started, but everywhere else, and Communist revolutions are not as fanatic, nor as lasting, as they once were.

Our foreign policy was much more satisfactory and effective before we aped dictatorships by making it a function of the White House and State Department. The U.S. Senate is supposed to have a great deal more to do with our relations with other countries than it has had since the late Franklin D. Roosevelt took it over, and his successor, Harry S. Truman, ordered our troops into Korea without even asking Congress for its blessing.

We believe Senator Fulbright is qualified to serve as head of the foreign relations committee and we suspect Secretary Dulles will do well from now on to consult him on foreign relations before taking off for Europe, Asia, or wherever to learn what our allies think of some new Communist aggression. It may pay us to adopt some independent policies.



Like lamb?
It is flavorful meat, but are you really taking full advantage of its versatility? Served Many Ways

In Mediterranean countries, lamb is the mainstay of the meat diet. It's served in such diverse ways, .however, that even after four days of lamb dinners you're not really conscious you've been eating lamb, lamb, lamb! In America, the reverse is true. Creamy Tomato Sauce: Sprinkle 2 lamb leg steaks, about 3/4 in. thick, with salt and pepper. Broil 3 to 4 in. from source of heat for 5 to 7 min., or until lightly browned.



DINNER'S SERVED: broiled lamb leg steaks with creamy tomato sauce, buttered carrots, orange and grapefruit salad

Turn. Broil 5 min., or until desired degree of doneness.

Combine ½ c. commercial sour cream, 1 (6-oz. can) tomato paste, ¼ c. chopped chives, 1 tbsp. sugar, ½ tsp. salt, ½ tsp. pepper. Blend. Serve with lamb steaks. Makes 4 portions.

Lamb Riblets with Lemon Barbecue Sauce: Cook 1½ lbs. sized onion, sliced, until lamb

is lightly browned on all sides.
Combine ½ c. chili sauce, 1/2 c. ketchup, 1/4 c. lemon juice, 2 thep. sugar, ½ tsp. chill powder, ½ tsp. salt, ¼ tsp. pepper. Mix well. Pour over lamb. Top with slices from 1 medium-sized lemon.

Cover and cook over low heat 1 hr., or until lamb is tender. Serves 4. Lamb Spareribs with Mush-

room Sauce: Place 3 lbs. lamb spareribs on rack in shallow roasting pan. Bake in slow oven, 325 F., for 11/4 hrs. Drain Melt 2 thsp. butter or margarine; add 1 c. sliced mush-

rooms and cook 5 min. Add 2 tbsp. all-purpose flour, 1 tsp. garlic salt, ½ tsp. salt, ¼ tsp. pepper and blend. Gradually add 1 c. lamb stock or bouillon and cook over low heat, stirring constantly until thick-ened. Pour over spareribs. Bake 45 min.


