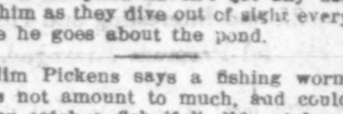

ALLIES WILL CONSIDER COTTON AS CONTRABAND

Statement is Authorized at the British Embassy at Washington.

Washington, Aug. 20.—The allied governments have agreed in principle that cotton is contraband of war. The exact date when this announcement shall be made is still under consideration.

This statement was authorized today at the British embassy. As soon as the official announcement is made, it will be disclosed also that the allied governments have prepared to stand behind the market to prevent ruinous depression of prices and minimize hardships to planters.

It was explained here today that the allies refrained from making cotton contraband at the outset of the war because of conditions in the United States, where a large crop had been planted and a contraband order then would, in their opinion, have been far more serious.

Now the allies contend the cotton states have been prepared for a change in policy by reductions of acreage. Some of the cotton interests, allied quarters acknowledge, may be affected by the change, and for that reason it has been decided to stand behind the market to minimize embarrassment and to avoid a permanent decrease in American cotton plantings.

The principal reason for declaring cotton contraband is that it is one of the principal sources of smokeless powder. How the allies propose to support the cotton market is not explained here.

WAR NEWS AT A GLANCE.

The sinking by a German submarine of the White Star liner Arabic, carrying 423 persons, including 26 Americans, was the most sensational event of a day of important war developments. The White Star Line reports that the vessel was sunk without warning. The destruction of the Arabic caused grave concern at Washington, but no official statement will be made until all the facts are at hand. The last American note to Germany on the sinking of the Lusitania specifically stated that "the lives of noncombatants may in no case be put in jeopardy unless the vessel resists or seeks to escape after being summoned to submit to an examination." The Tonic invaders still are battering successfully at the Russian fortresses, back of which it had been believed the grand duke was to make a stand. Forces under Field Marshal von Mackensen have penetrated into the outer positions at East-Litovsk, strongest of Muscovite defense works. Two additional forts have fallen at

MORE LIGHT ON SUICIDE PACT OF W. REED AND WIFE

Will Reed, who lived in the extreme northwest section of the county, committed suicide last Friday afternoon at about 4 o'clock by taking carbolic acid. Mrs. Reed, who entered in a compact with her husband to destroy her life, is recovering from the effects of the small portion of the poison that she swallowed. Reed and his wife separated some few weeks ago and later went back together. The day before the deed was committed Reed was in Hardin and returning home stopped at Kirksey and secured a small bottle of carbolic acid. Going to his home he and his wife agreed to take their own lives. They addressed a letter to members of the family directing the disposition of their possessions and stating how and where they wished to be buried. After writing the letter they started across the field to the home of Wesley Bell, father of Mrs. Reed, and when within about one hundred yards of the house, swallowed the acid. They reached the house and asked that the bed be prepared for them, telling of their deed. Reed died within a very short time and before medical aid could be summoned. Mrs. Reed evidently failed to take as much of the poison as her husband and after a few hours of attention she was pronounced out of danger. Coroner Churchill was summoned to the Bell home where an inquest was held and a verdict of suicide returned in the case of Reed. The burial took place Saturday in Graves county.

NOVOGORIEVSK, and the army of Gen. von Gallwitz has reached the railway station at Bialystok to East-Litovsk.

On the western front the French claim to have captured the cross roads east of Notre Dame de Lorette, through which the Arras-Bethune and Angres-Ablain highways run, putting them in a position to make effective attacks north and northeast of Soches. The British have landed additional troops on the Gallipoli Peninsula, but the war office admits that the British advance was halted. Losses on both sides were heavy. Late advices from the Dardanelles have indicated that the allies had determined upon a desperate effort to force the straits, to open a way for war munitions to enter Russia and perhaps influence sentiment in the Balkans. Berlin announces that a British cruiser and torpedo boat destroyer were sunk off Jutland Tuesday in an engagement with German torpedo boat destroyers. A big fleet of German warships is threatening Riga, the Russian Baltic port. The Italians are declared to have in readiness in the south a strong squadron, which will be sent to attack Turkey if the Ottoman government does not permit Italians to leave that country.

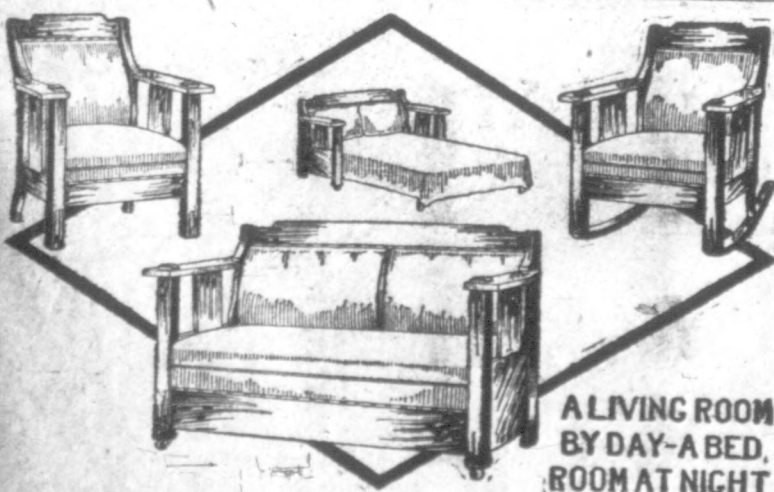

VILLA WANTS PEACE

General Willing That Provisional Government be Established.

El Paso, Texas, Aug. 20.—Following is the official text of Gen. Villa's reply to the Pan-American appeal for peace: "I as general-in-chief of the conventionist army, have been informed with satisfaction of the friendly note which your excellencies have addressed to me and which I received on the night of Aug. 5.

"In replying, I have the honor to inform you that the convention government is strong enough through its own force and power to continue the fight defending the institutions belonging to the Mexican people until such a time as the high ideals of the revolution which guarantee a solid and stable peace are realized; but taking into consideration the friendly and brotherly attitude of the United States of America and our sisters, the Latin-American republics of Brazil, Chile, Argentine, Bolivia, Uruguay and Guatemala, with the end that the peace in Mexico must be an immediate fact and constitutional order duly established, we are ready to accept and cordially we do accept the good offices of your excellencies toward calling a reunion of delegates of the contending parties recognized in Mexico. It will be possible for them to reach a satisfactory agreement, thus saving the national honor, well understanding that the conventional government is willing to make all kinds of efforts to correspond to the good will expressed by your excellencies.

"I want to state clearly that all military chiefs as well as the civilians attached to the conventionist army are willing to establish in Mexico a provisional government that will guarantee the elections to which people will be convoked to elect with liberty its offices as we have no further desire except that the nomination will be in favor of a determined man. I have the honor to reiterate to your excellencies the sincerity of my highest esteem.

"FRANCISCO VILLA. "General-in-Chief of Operations." Minister of Foreign Relations Miguel Diaz Lombardo of the conventionist cabinet telegraphed to the Pan-American diplomats that the military and civil chiefs of the convention government would reply to the message this week.

FORMER GOVERNOR

Replies to Statement Issued by Atlanta's Mayor.

San Francisco, Aug. 20.—Former Gov. John M. Slaton, of Georgia, who commuted the death sentence of Leo M. Frank to one of life imprisonment, issued a statement here condemning an address delivered Tuesday by Mayor J. G. Woodward, of Atlanta, Ga., and terming the mayor "old and garrulous." He called the Frank case a "football of politics."

Commenting on Mr. Woodward's statement that three-fourths of the people of Georgia, including himself, believed Frank guilty and condoning the lynching, Mr. Slaton said: "Similar utterances made before the lynching naturally resulted in subsequent lawlessness. In one breath he

WILL PRESERVE TREE

Wall to be Built Around Oak on Which Frank Was Hanged.

Marietta, Ga., Aug. 20.—The big oak tree near the W. J. Frey cotton gin, two miles from here, on which the lifeless body of Leo M. Frank was found dangling last Tuesday morning, soon is to be surrounded with a concrete wall, according to an announcement made here tonight, and thus preserved by the owner to mark the death place of the alleged slayer of Mary Phagan.

In the meantime the tree is being guarded by watchmen both night and day. It was stated today that Mr. Frey had been offered \$200 for the tree. He declined the offer and in doing so the plan to build a wall about the tragically historic oak became known. The watchmen were placed on duty to prevent souvenir hunters or others from molesting it. Visitors to Marietta during the past two days have been unusually numerous and practically all have visited

the scene of the lynching.

FRANK PHOTOS CONFISCATED. Chattanooga, Tenn., Aug. 20.—Chief Hackett of the Chattanooga police today confiscated a large number of photographs of the body of Leo M. Frank, dangling from the tree near Marietta, and ordered the two Atlanta men engaged in selling the pictures on the streets here to "get back to Georgia." They said they were agents for an Atlanta photographer.
