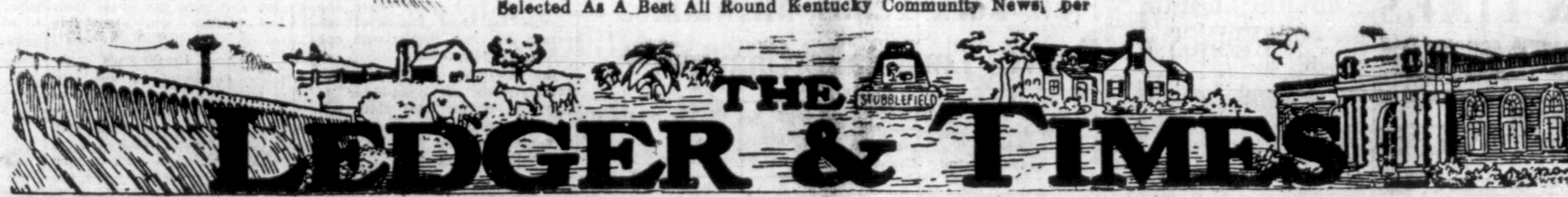

New York Yanks, Milwaukee Braves Look Like Champions

It's axiomatic that the New York Yanks and Milwaukee Braves never look more like champions than when Whitey Ford and Lew Burdette are throwing goose-eggs at the opposition.

And, it's equally true that nothing can make a major league team look worse than its pitching collapse. Both propositions were demonstrated dramatically Wednesday night when the Yanks and Braves scored brilliant victories on the strength of their pitching and the Cincinnati Reds and Kansas City Athletics suffered humiliating defeats through inability to hold big early leads.

Whiffs Pile Up

Ford, pitching perhaps the finest game of his career, limited the Washington Senators to seven hits and struck out 15 batters in a 1-0, 14-inning victory while Burdette, off to one of the fastest starts of his career, out-duelled Robin Roberts to defeat the Philadelphia Phillies, 2-0. The Yanks thus kept the pressure on the front-running Cleveland Indians in the American League race and the Braves kept their lead in the National League chase.

Smith sat back comfortably when his Reds scored six runs in the third inning and led, 7-0, at the end of five innings. Then he groaned in despair as the Pittsburgh Pirates rallied to tie with seven runs in the seventh and went on to win, 9-8, on a ninth-inning single by Rocky Nelson.

Walk, Walk, Walk

Craft was living it up like Casey Stengel when his Athletics ran up a 6-1 lead on the Chicago White Sox after two innings. But the White Sox ruined his night by rallying to lead, 8-6, after six innings and then left him crushed when they tallied 11 runs on eight walks, one hit batsman, three errors and one solitary single in the seventh frame for a 20-6 triumph!

The Indians walloped the Detroit Tigers, 10-1, for their eighth win in nine games and the Boston Red Sox beat the Baltimore Orioles, 8-4, in "the other" American League game. The San Francisco Giants downed the Los Angeles

three-hour and 40-minute marathon at Washington when he blasted his third homer of the season off Chuck Stobbe with one out in the 14th inning. Burdette, now 3-0 for the season, pitched an eight-hitter to give the Braves their sixth win in seven games. Nelson broke up the Pittsburgh-Cincinnati shindig with a ninth-inning single that scored Bill Virdon and gave the Pirates their second straight win after five losses.

Dodgers, 6-3, in the other National League game. Bill Skowron broke up the

inching single that scored Nelson Fox drove in five runs with four hits and Luis Aparicio knocked in four with three blows but the bulk of the White Sox' huge scoring total resulted from 13 walks and four errors. Buck Gorman (charged with six runs without getting a man out) and George Brunet (walked five batters and hit one) were the real victims of the 11-run White Sox inning.

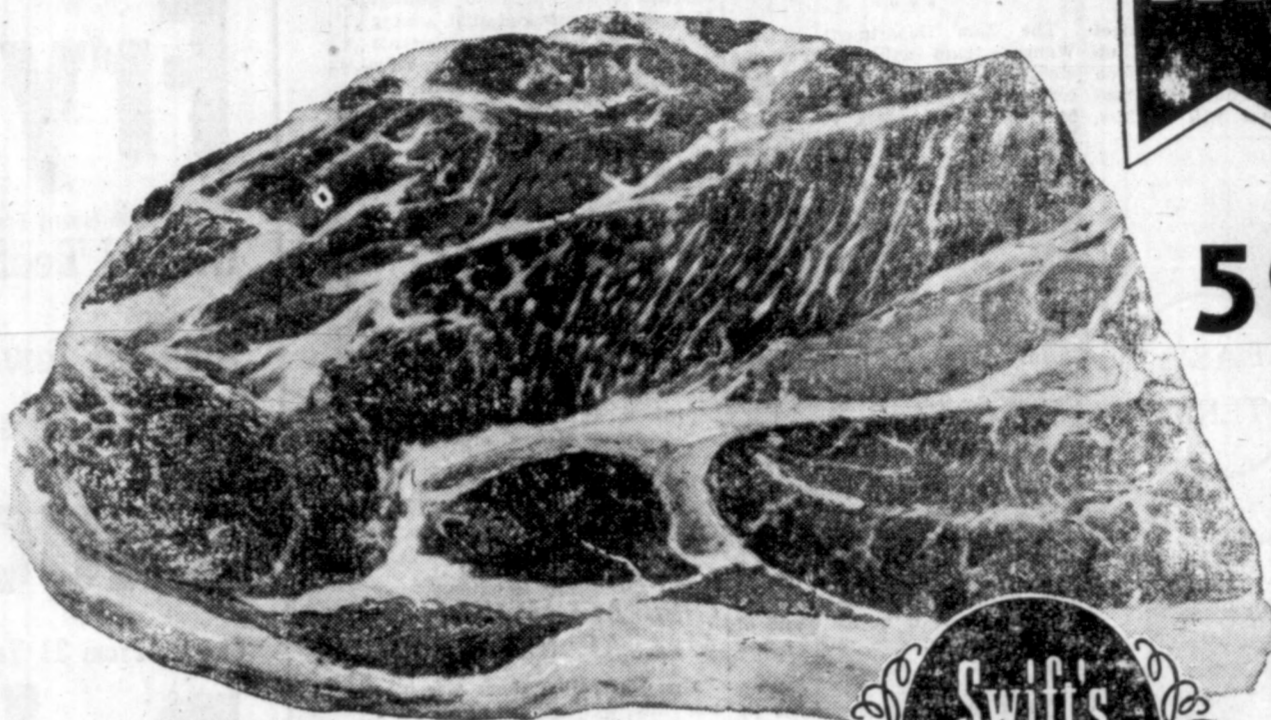

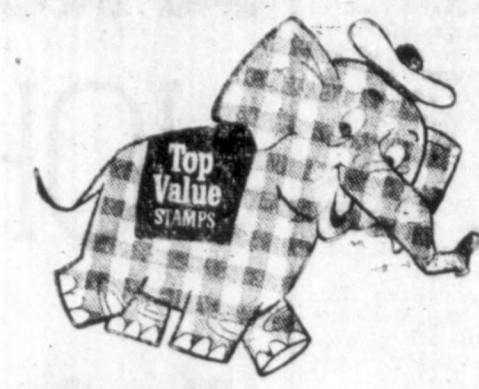
Chatterbox Bridge Club Meets With Mrs. M. Stallons

clubs have invited the girls to come before them and explain their situation, and tell them how they can have a part in ending these Scouts who will represent us in this "A Mile High—A World Wide" program.

The Girl Scout Council has provided four tents, cots, kitchen equipment and larger items which will be returned to Murray to be used again. The Council has given each girl \$10.00 toward her \$60.00 registration fee.

The girls' parents have supplied personal equipment that includes clothing, kit, and gear costing \$50.00 per girl.

The Senior troops have raised \$200 toward the \$500 by selling calendars, and cookies, baby sitting, and servicing local telephones with plastic advertising caps.

They have worked in the hospital as aides many hours in the school library one period per day all this year, helped with the civil defense program helped with younger scout troops, and served in the water safety program. All this on a voluntary basis.

They have learned the simple conversational language of Spanish, Japanese, French, and German the natives of those countries who are living here. The girls must be able to converse with girls of other lands when they get to Roundup.

No member of the Girl Scout Council, leader or executive is paid for her work here. It is all done for free. Eight girls are qualified to go to Roundup.

Contrast that number with that of the Bear Creek Council consisting of nine counties, including Paducah—Only eight girls from all that area are going and they have a paid executive force to direct Scouting there.

Our Girl Scouts have cost us practically nothing. This trip will mean much to us and to them. Let's help them catch this train by giving \$300.00 before May 1.

Martin was the only mutineer who was armed. Where he got the .22 caliber pistol he carried was not known.

The other four ringleaders were identified as Thomas Carlin, Peter Markovitz, Lawrence Wood and Russell Red Halliday.

Authorities said there was apparently a vague plan to reach the main entrance of the reformatory. At one point Martin told Supt. Edward S. Grennan bluntly, "I want out."

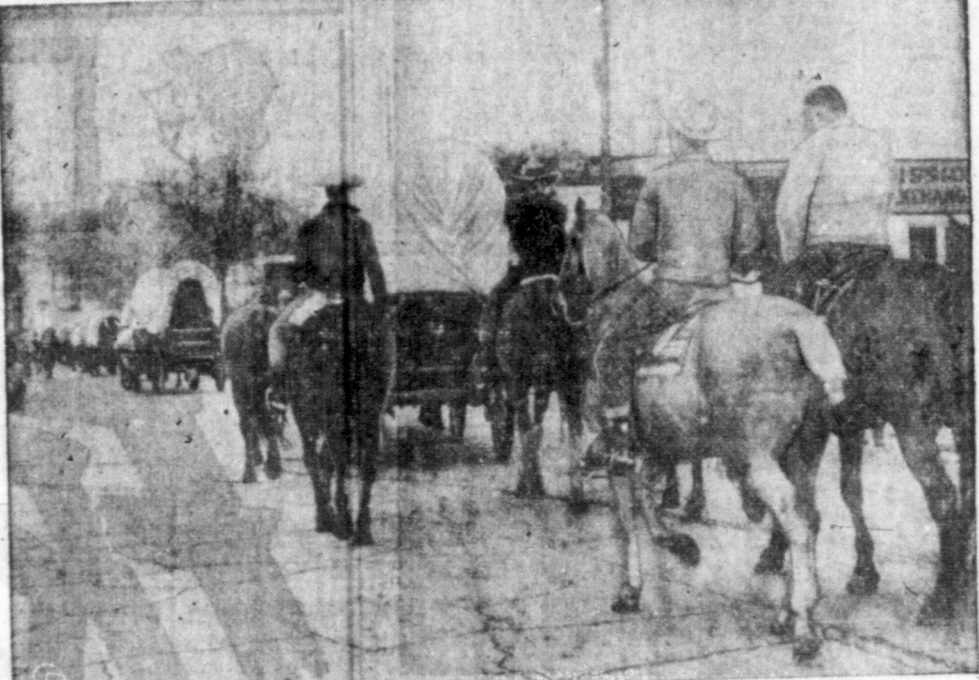
Taken By Force

"They had no grievances. This was purely and simply an escape attempt. I told them to surrender or we will come in and get you," Grennan said.

Authorities said every one of the ringleaders "had to be taken by force." But the other prisoners appeared glad it was over and offered no resistance.

The convicts had locked the hostages in cells. All were freed unharmed. They included Assistant Deputy Warden Edward P. O'Neil, 12 guards and two civilian employees.

It was at first believed that Martin F. Feeney, 43, veteran bank robber and eight-time jail breaker who led a March 7 uprising at Walpole State Prison, was again a ringleader. But this was later found to be untrue and was officially denied by prison spokesmen.

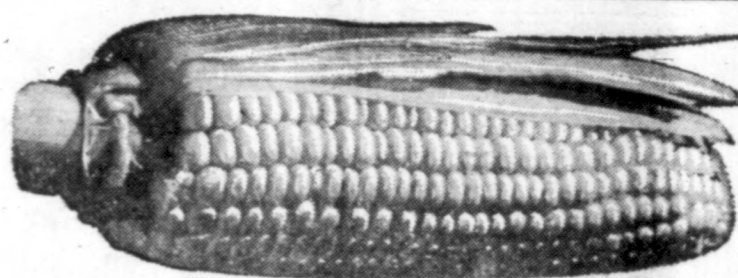

CELEBRATED BY THE PIRATE KING, the ship was a mid-china blue. I would learn how quickly they could darken when passion seized him, how they could shower forth visible sparks on the object of his Tom Hoyt and I were confined to quarters until morning.

Yours will, too. It's a U. S. Bureau of Standards piece of business, to bring the U. S. inch into line with the inch of English speaking nations. Our new inch will be 2.54 centimeters instead of the present elongated 2.540005 centimeters. Further, North America will be 25 feet wider. (Central Press)

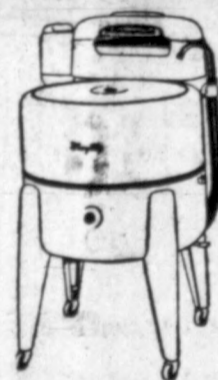

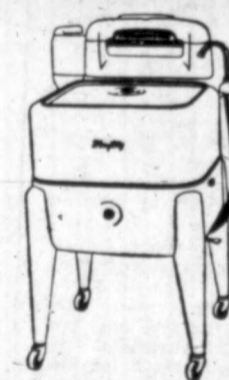

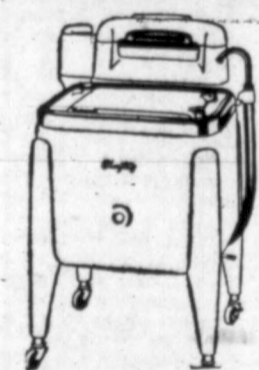
