





On the other hand, this same detachment can produce apprehension in others who come steaming to the White House with a burning problem and find him somewhat unimpressed.

The study of his reaction crisis becomes further complicated when he seems to blow up over something inconsequential—a bad golf shot, a minor malperformance by some subordinate, scalding coffee or the weather.

Actualy, the detachment toward major matters, according to those with an opportunity for first-hand knowledge, stems from his days as a military commander. He could not aford in those days to be whirled into excitement when of men into battle.

Thus, when the world seems to come tumbling down in these days of the cold war, the President tries to play it cool.

If there is a White House staff member mentally packing his bags in the hope of a nice late summer vacation on the seashore with the President, here's a piece of kind advice-unpack.

The President really meant i the other day when he wrote the mayor of Newport, R. I., that he didn't "dare" think of vacation plans. If and when Congress adjourns, and if and when there i a summit meeting it probably will leave Eisenhower no time at all for anything but some weekends on the farm at Gettysburg.


