IS THIS RIGHT? There are many lawyers all over the United States who are being employed to get up all kinds of petitions and affidavits in order to get certain young men out of the army, for which they get all kinds of fees. In our opinion this is absolutely contrary to our draft and volunteer systems. Who is it that cannot get a certificate from some cause or other, who has a lawyer to assist in writing these things up? In some sections of the country attorneys are having trouble and are made to pay back fees which they have collected in order to get their clients discharged from the army.

This is another practice the government will have to step in and stop. Because when one boy is taken out of class 1 and put in 2, 3 or 4, most generally in class 4, then another boy has to be taken from his home and put in this place.

It is said that over 100 have been recommended for exemption or for the farms in this county, and of course probably it is worse in other counties. The general public is going to kick about these things, because every young man should take his place when his number is reached, and that no attorney or anybody else should interfere, preventing them from filling their places in the army.


