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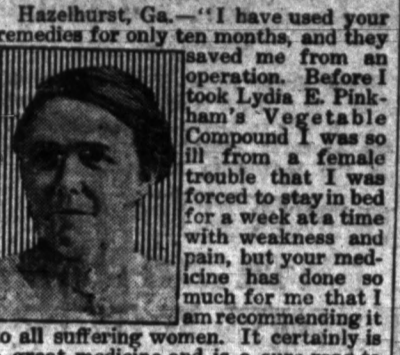

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**BRONZE AND SILVER BUTTON FOR SOLDIERS**

These Are For Wear With Civilian Clothing.

The war department has ordered issued to all honorably discharged officers, enlisted men, except members of the student army training corps, bronze and silver buttons for wear with civilian clothing. The silver button will be issued only to those who have sustained wounds in the service.

The army recruiting station located at 139 East Main street, Lexington, Ky., will shortly have a supply of these buttons which will be mailed to those ex-members of the army desiring them.

The application should show clearly the name and address of the applicant and be accompanied by the original discharge certificate, attested by a civil or military officer or a true copy of same. as receivers to take charge of the money and bonds to be paid by West Virginia in settlement of the debt.

The motion was filed by Attorney Gen. Saunders, of Virginia, and concurred in by attorneys representing the bondholding creditors and certificate holders. Under the supreme court's judgment, rendered in 1915, West Virginia was required to pay \$12,000,000, with interest, of Virginia's old Civil War debt. Under the agreement West Virginia has already paid \$1,000,000 in cash and is also to turn over to Virginia \$15,400,000 in 3-1/2 per cent bonds, less \$1,000,000 in bonds to be held in the West Virginia treasury against certain certificates of indebtedness which have been lost and "have never been delivered to the older state."

In submitting the motion the suggestion was made that William A. Glasgow be named as special master and that the Central Union Trust Company of New York be designated as the depository for the bonds.
